Suffolk Police reorganised their Community Policing Model in December 2023.

Tuddenham St. Martin is now part of Ipswich East and is in the Woodbridge and Wickham Market area. According to the web site they have no meetings planned yet for 2024.

Looking at Suffolk Police web site for this year it shows one crime for Tuddenham, in March 2024, a Burglary.

Tim Passmore (Conservative Party) has been re-elected as the Police and Crime Commissioner for Suffolk. Residents across Suffolk voted on Thursday 2 May 2024, in the countywide election which saw a turnout of 22.9%.

Road Signage and other highway concerns Work is progressing on this with support from the Highways officer and our County Councillor. The meeting is being asked to make a contribution to the proposal submitted and I support any decision for us to contribute to this if it enables the work to be progressed (ref the £4000 put into the PC budget for highways matters). Speedwatch and enforcement The team has been out on several occasions since the last PC meeting and hopefully with the return of warmer weather we can continue our efforts through the spring. We have not received any data from the enforcement activity by the Police.

SID's The village now has its own SID and thanks to the PC members Jim and David who are maintaining its functioning and downloading data. I hope at the next meeting we can produce some data about volume and speeds (with timings) for our meeting In July. The SAVID shared SID will continue to rotate between Tuddenham and Swilland and Witnesham and the location for this SID will be reviewed at the next SAVID meeting.

has welcomed Charsfield as members and we continue to support the various activities in our villages around traffic speed and other safety concerns. We have been successful in getting funding for an additional SID which is enabling each member village to have its own SID. We are aiming to continue to analyse data from the SID's to inform best timings for Speedwatch activity as there is evidence that both activities can positively influence drivers speeding reduction. We are awaiting update from the Police about the future management of Speedwatch following internal changes within the Police. Our next meeting will be June 20th 2024.

ANPR scheme The ANPR device was in the village in March and I have written to the coordinator for feedback about the project which is due to continue.

30mph Speed Signs on Road side bins I have not been able to give priority to this issue since discussion at previous meetings but think we should keep this issue 'alive'.

20's plenty The aspirations for this progressing in Suffolk are still present in both SAVID and other communities. I missed a zoom event in March but have signed in for one on May 20th.

Road Safety Forum and East Suffolk Community Partnerships Budget

The Group has met once this year and agreed on future actions and on road safety continuing to be a priority for the Partnership. Planning for Road safety week in November will be one of the priorities for the next meeting.
